We want to thank everyone involved with the annual TCS bazaar. This event is always a fun day of camaraderie and shopping, and together with the money made at the farm show, and a contribution by Scotia Bank, we raised almost \$13,000 this year. Praise God!

At the Spring Membership Meeting we will be proposing a budget that we believe is both challenging and realistic. The Board appreciates the support of our Christian community in all fundraising processes that are essential to keep Christian education affordable for parents. The Board, Recruitment Team, and our Principal are working hard to seek out new families to join with us in the mission of "developing Christian minds". I would like to encourage each of our current parents and supporters to be part of the recruitment process. With only two new families, we could eliminate the proposed deficit budget for next year. We have an excellent school with space and opportunity for more children. If you know a family who may be interested in learning more, encourage them to come to a Welcome Wednesday. On Wednesdays and other days by appointment, interested families can see the school in action and learn more about how Christian education can benefit their child.

As an aside, the annual spring drive is just around the corner. We hope to raise \$35,000 during this drive, and if all of the 2010/11 financial goals are met, we anticipate to have a carryover of \$10,000 or more to offset the proposed 2011/12 deficit budget of \$16,500. Great things are possible, with God's blessings and people like you!

One last thing: My term as treasurer is up this spring. I would like to thank the Board, and the Finance Committee for all their help, support, and patience. It's been great working with everyone and a great learning experience in my life.

# Minutes: TCS membership meeting

November 18, 2010, TCS Gym, 7:30 p.m.

- 1. Opening and welcome** – Ralph Norg welcomed everyone. We sang “Great is the Lord” and “Give Thanks”. Ralph read from Deut. 6:6-7; 8:1-8, a portion from the devotional “Daylight” – The Battle and prayer.
- 2. Review of Spring Membership Meeting Minutes, April 22, 2010.** The minutes were approved by the Board already. Motion to accept the Spring Membership April 22, 2010 minutes - Art Pol; seconded by John Knier. Carried.
- 3. Principal’s Report – Gary Postma**
  - Gary talked about the report summary on our School Quality Assurance Program (SQAP) review. The results from this gathered information has given us a 5-year operational plan. It has 8 key areas that we would like to focus on each year, and it highlights the processes that are already underway. Gary highlighted different areas that have been worked on. The Staff and Board review this plan regularly; when different issues arise they can be added or discussed. It is a working document that helps organize strategies.
  - WOM (word of mouth) - current parents talking knowledgably with friends about our school. We need a culture of referral – Gary shared an article from Christian Schools International on “Ten Questions for your Church about Christian School Education”. Gary mentioned the benefit of the articles in the OACS Communicator as great reference material to promote using WOM. Welcome Wednesday is also available to help promote growth.
  - School theme – Kids of Integrity.
  - Gary finished with reading Proverbs 3:3.
  - Questions: none
- 4. French Curriculum – Marlene Luchies**
  - Marlene gave a presentation on the new program she is teaching this year: AIM (Accelerated Integrated Method). This French program focuses on learning through stories, drama, visual, oral, actions and music. Marlene is very enthusiastic about this new program and is finding the students are responding to it very positively. She showed a short video from the AIM promotional DVD. This program is being used in 4000 schools across Canada.
- 5. Board Member Election** – Terry Luchies has stepped down because Marlene is currently on staff. Art Pol is standing for Board nomination to fill the vacant spot.
- 6. Board Report - Cathy Dentz**
  - Communication between the Board and parents, Staff and Membership is done using the Touch Point and TCS Contact newsletters, which are very important tools. A new survey will be sent out to all families for giving your input and feelings on how the school is doing. This will help us as Board and staff to stay current on your needs, input and feedback.
  - Volunteer Points System – The school used to have a point system to encourage all parents and families to participate in the school for things such as classroom help, bazaars or committees. If the total volunteer points had not been accumulated, there was to be a financial penalty. The system wasn’t working very well and has now been eliminated. The Board is encouraging everyone to volunteer in any way you feel comfortable helping.
  - Comment: A member comment was made on the importance of communication – that we are “lukewarm” now as a society; the school was founded with great communication.
- 7. Ballot report - Pat Havennar** – Art Pol has been accepted as a Board member.  
Motion to destroy ballots; moved by Pat Havenaar; seconded by Cathy Dentz. Carried
- 8. Board Report - Ralph Norg**
  - 50th Anniversary Committee - Andrew Bouwman is in charge of the committee. If anyone is interested in helping to serve on this committee please talk to Andrew.
  - Endowment Fund is doing well and growing.

- Curriculum - we are continuing to improve.
- Regeneration and revitalization – is continuing – the bathrooms have been redone.
- Honorary Membership Program – we're thankful for these members, but we are discontinuing the program. We will Grandfather this program out.
- Appreciation was given to our fundraising support. Acknowledgement was given to Timmy's Place and the support from them, and their service to the community. And, also the pie-making support.

**9. Financial Report** – Pat Havenaar reviewed the 2009-2010 school year financial statements. The books were received by Patsy VanderMeulen and Harry Van't Foort.

- Motion to accept the 2009-10 school year financial statements as presented, moved by Bert Mudde; seconded by Marlene Luchies.
- Question: Jack VanGilst asked re: Memorial Endowment Fund is shown in two places, as an asset and a liability, on the financial statement, page 8 "TCS Contact" – Lianne Tibben explained that the school borrowed money from the Memorial fund and it is now being paid back. Cathy Dentz helped clarify that there are two different funds - the Endowment Fund and the TCS Memorial Scholarship Fund – donations are directed to the fund as requested by the donor (currently half of the donated money goes to the school capital fund and half goes to the memorial fund).
- Question: Wendy Heuvel asked re: once the debt is paid back to the Memorial Fund, will the funds then collected go to school capital - yes.
- Motion - Carried.

### 10. Question Period:

- Julie Potvin asked about the holes in the driveway. It was graded over this past spring but the run-off has now created another washout at the driveway entrance. The maintenance committee will be notified of this problem.

### 11. Promotions committee report – Marlene Luchies
